## Message from Mr. Chisholm:

SAA Parking:

As we come close to the end of the school year I know many parents would agree with me that the expanded SAA parking lot has been a blessing for our community - especially during early dismissals.

That being said, there are some important reminders I would like to share with our community to ensure the safety of all of our parking lot users:

- Stopping and leaving your vehicle in the drop off circle or behind other parked cars is forbidden and presents an unnecessary safety risk for our students. With the visitor stalls remaining in front of the school and the new, additional parking stalls at the west end of the parking lot there is no need to park in the drop off zone or behind other parked vehicles. There is a safety issue as most vehicles back out of their spots and should not assume that a vehicle will be stopped or doing a drop off behind them.
- The south side of the upper parking lot is designated for staff parking so please do not take a staff member's spot especially when there are often sufficient spaces allocated for our parent parking.
- Student parking is clearly marked at the west end of the lot and I ask that our parents not use these student-designated parking stalls, especially in the morning.
- Our new parking area has one-way traffic through this area with a loop at the far west end of our lot behind the upper field.
- Congestion leaving the school is still a reality as there is only one entry/exit point for the school. Much of the congestion is often caused when access to 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave. is difficult due to traffic volume. A solution to this problem that many of our parents are using is to take a right turn as they leave the school and then the first left turn to travel through the hospital. If you then make a right turn at the first stop sign you will be able to access Columbia St. via the roads at the bottom of the hill.
- While our expanded on-site parking has improved the traffic flow at SAA, I do anticipate continued challenges in the future. Therefore, I ask that all of our

parking lot users follow these practices and remain patient, understanding and civil when using the SAA parking lot.
