YOUNG AUTHORS' CONFERENCE - MAY 4, 2018

The Young Authors' Conference is a full day conference held at Thompson Rivers University for aspiring young writers. Participating grade 4-12 students attend workshops facilitated by published writers, develop their writing skills, and collaborate with peers. To enter, a student must submit a <u>manuscript</u> of script, prose, or poetry to their classroom teacher (elementary students) or English teacher (high school students) by **April 6, 2018.** The school contact refers the manuscript to a school-based committee that

selects outstanding compositions. Authors of these compositions are invited to attend the conference. Each year about 150 to 200 students participate in the conference. SUPERVISION REMINDER

Outdoor supervision is provided for students between 8:00 AM and 3:00 PM during the school week. Students are to be outside during non-instructional times where proper supervision is scheduled. While we understand the occasional event occurs which might cause you to be late in picking up your child, we ask that you let the office and classroom teacher know in advance. Many times, teachers have meetings or other school-related events happening before and after school, and students are not to be in the hallways or cafeteria without supervision.
