DRESS FOR THE WEATHER

With the winter weather having arrived in Kamloops, parents are reminded to please send their child to school will **proper outerwear** which includes winter jacket, snow pants, winter boots, hats/toques, and mittens/gloves. Students will be spending time outside in the winter during recess and lunch and it is important they are properly dressed for the weather. Best Concert Dress

Mrs. Mahoney, our elementary Music teacher, requests that all students come in their best concert dress unless they are one of the actors in the musical. Costumes will be provided to the actors.

Please note that students are asked to wear "**Best Concert Dress**" which refers to the following:

- **Blue jeans are not permitted**
- Dresses must be knee-length
- **Refrain** from wearing make-up, large pieces of jewellery or high heels

BC Universities & Colleges Hosting Free Public Information Night

KAMLOOPS – Fourteen [14] BC universities and colleges will be in attendance at a free public Post-Secondary Information Night event next **Wednesday, Nov. 15th** starting at 7:00 pm at the **Colombo Lodge in Kamloops**.

This is the fourth year that PSI-BC is hosting an evening for parents and local secondary school students, to help them better understand the BC post-secondary system and access information directly from institutions as they look ahead to making decisions on which college or university program they might attend.

While post-secondary reps have visited high schools in Kamloops and around the province for many years, the school-hour schedule has traditionally made it difficult for parents to participate in the conversation. The evening highlights the many post-secondary options and paths available students in BC, and is designed to allow parents and students to interact directly with representatives from all 14 institutions in attendance during the 2-hour event that runs from 7 to 9 pm.

PSI-BC is a collaborative group of post-secondary institutions supporting students and high school counsellors in BC high schools. The group strives to assist each student in their search to find both the institution and the program available in the province that best fits their personal and career objectives.
