UPDATES TO PARENT AND STUDENT HANDBOOKS

Updates to the Handbooks are noted in blue font below. Changes to the Handbooks have been approved by SAA School Council.

Elementary Electronics Policy

Items such as personal music players, cell phones and Smart phones should not be brought to class and are <u>not</u> to be used within the school building for the duration of the school day (including recess and lunch). Cell phones and other electronic devices are not to be used on the <u>playground</u> during school-offered supervision times (8:00 AM to 3:00 PM) except to receive phone calls/texts from parents <u>after</u> 2:30 PM. Parents must contact their child via the Main Office between the hours of 8:00 AM to 2:30 PM should they wish to pass on a message to their child. During field trips, the use of electronics during times of transportation for long distance trips are at the *discretion of the teacher*, but electronics/phones must not be used while field trips or athletic events are in progress (this includes school-organized after-school events).

In the event that a student is found to be in violation of this policy, the items will be confiscated by staff and stored at the office and will only be returned to parents. A

second violation of this policy will result in the item being confiscated once again and the student being required to serve 5 hours of school community service. Subsequent offences of this policy will require the student and parents meet with Administration and the school Pastor to determine the assignment of greater disciplinary consequences which may include more community service hours, a school suspension or possibly expulsion.

To support our students in this policy parents are asked not to contact their children on cell phones during school hours. If an emergency arises, contact the school office and students will be informed immediately.

ELEMENTARY DRESS CODE: Grades 1 – 7

Uniforms are mandatory, and this includes gym strip. All students in grades 1-7 are expected to follow this dress code. Kindergarten students do not wear a school uniform or SAA gym strip.

√ Play Clothes

Mass Dress

Boys:

- √ White collared dress shirt with school tie and navy dress pants or navy dress shorts
- √ Navy dress shorts and white collared short-sleeve dress shirt with school tie
- Girls:

 ✓ White collared blouse with navy tunic, skirt, skort or navy dress pant
 *SAA hoodies or sweatshirts must be removed during school Mass.

High School Uniform (Grades 8 & 9)

Grade 8 & 9 - Regular Uniform

Boys:

- ✓ Navy or khaki pants or shorts
- ✓ White or blue shirts (long or short sleeved)
- ✓ White or dark green golf shirt (long or short sleeved)-crested
- √ Navy/gold tie
- ✓ Optional items: School crested vest, sweatshirt, hoodie or zip front jersey knit jacket (navy blue colour only)

✓ Optional item: Grade 8 students are permitted to wear Grade 7 Grad hoodie for Grade 8 year only

Girls:

- √ Navy or khaki pants, shorts
- ✓ Tartan or beige skort
- ✓ White or blue blouse (long or short sleeved)
- √ White or dark green golf shirt (long or short sleeved)-crested
- ✓ Knee socks if wearing a skort (navy, green or white)
- ✓ Optional items: School crested vest, sweatshirt, hoodie or zip front jersey knit jacket (navy blue colour only)
- ✓ Optional item: tie (tartan or green)
- ✓ Optional items: solid-coloured white, navy, dark green, grey, or black tights/leggings may be worn under skort
- ✓ Optional item: Grade 8 students are permitted to wear Grade 7 Grad hoodie for Grade 8 year only

Walkathon Pledge Forms will be sent home

On **Friday**, **September 15**, your child will receive a St. Ann's Academy Walkathon pledge sheet. The Walkathon will take place on Friday, October 6. **Students can continue to collect pledges after the Walkathon up until our Final Walkathon Assembly on October 31**. The funds collected this year will enhance student learning at SAA. We are very appreciative of the generous donations from our families and the Kamloops community in support of our school.

Early Daily Draws

Students may start to bring in money and pledges on **Tuesday, October 10**. Your child will be entered into a random daily draw once for every \$25 that he/she collects in pledges. In order to be entered into the daily draws, the money and pledge forms must be turned into the main office by 9:00 AM each day. Elementary students may turn in their money and pledge forms to their classroom teachers while high school students may bring it directly to the office. Daily draw prizes this year include gift cards to Subway, Aberdeen Mall and Booster Juice. All money brought in prior to and including October 10th will be included in the **first early draw**. On the morning of October 11, the students will receive from their classroom or homeroom teachers one early draw ticket(s) for each \$25 they collect. They have until 2:00 pmthat day to enter their tickets into the draw barrel (which can be found at the main office). Early draws will continue on October 11, 12, 13 and 16. We will continue to collect money up until October 31 but to be entered in the final Walkathon prize draws, funds must be in by October 26.

If your child collects \$100 or more in pledges, he/she will receive a special SAA t-shirt.

Elementary students should be supervised when collecting pledges door-to-door to ensure safety at all times. All money and pledge forms must be returned to the school on or before Thursday, October 26, to ensure that students are entered into the draw for final prizes which will be drawn at our Final Walkathon Assembly on October 31.

Unused pledge forms must be returned to the school.

AIR QUALITY HEALTH INDEX – guidelines for student safety

Elementary students will be kept indoors when the Air Quality Health Index (AQHI), as indicated by Environment Canada on its website, reaches 7 or higher. We want to ensure the safety of our students and prevent them from engaging in strenuous activities during unstructured times (recess, lunch ,etc.). Please see below for important reminders...

<u>Morning Routine:</u> There is a morning supervisor outside each day beginning at 8:00 AM. When students arrive at school in the morning, they are to go directly outside to the playground. Students with classrooms upstairs must drop their backpack by the sign and go outside. <u>They should not be hanging up their backpacks on the hooks before 8:20 AM.</u> Students in grades 6 and 7 may drop their backpacks by their lockers and go outside. They should not be opening their lockers before 8:20 AM.

Staff members attend morning prayer and also attend meetings in the mornings before school and therefore are not available to supervise inside the school until after 8:20 AM. Thank you for your support.

Label All Belongings: It is very important that all student items are clearly labelled. It makes it much easier to return lost items to the rightful owner when there is a name on the item. Students in Grade 1 through to Grade 7 get changed for Physical Education classes. Gym strip, school uniform, and gym strip bags must all be clearly labeled with your child's name. You may wish to consider ordering labels from *Mabel's Labels*. Mabel's Labels is the best-known brand of durable labels for all of your children's items! Keep uniform pieces, lunch and gym bags, supplies and shoes organized and out of the lost and found! Crusader Wear Day: Once a month, Elementary students have the opportunity to participate in 'Crusader Wear Day'. Students are encouraged to wear SAA Crusader shirts and/or pants to show off their school spirit. Physical Education gym strip may be worn during the warmer weather on Crusader Wear Day. Students may prefer to wear regular school uniform on these days instead of Crusader Wear. Our first Crusader Wear Day of the year will be held on Friday, September 29.

<u>Dress Down Days:</u> During the school year, there will be a 'Dress Down Day' held each month with the intent on collecting money for charity. Each Dress Down Day will have a certain theme and students are invited to bring in \$1.00 to donate to the charity that is being supported each month. Students do not have to wear school uniform on these days but instead can dress in the theme (such as athletic wear or Terry Fox t-shirts on September 28 this month). For students who wish to dress in something other than the theme and not wear a school uniform, they are asked to bring in \$2.00 to support the charity. *Please note that dress code must always be followed and students are expected to dress in appropriate clothing.* Students are also welcome to dress in school uniform if they choose to not donate the money to charity that month.

Toonie for Terry: Terry Fox is a Canadian hero and has created a legacy by running his "Marathon of Hope" 34 years ago. To date, over \$650 million has been raised worldwide for cancer research in Terry's name through the annual Terry Fox Run, held across Canada and around the world. On Thursday, September 28, Elementary students will be participating in the Terry Fox Run at 1:45 PM on St. Ann's Academy school grounds. Intermediate students (Grades 4-7) will run laps on the upper field while Primary students (Grades K-3) will run laps on the lower field. Students are asked to wear a Terry Fox t-shirt, or a t-shirt in support of other cancer-related events, or other athletic clothing with good outdoor running shoes, and bring in a "toonie for Terry.'Students should also have a water bottle. Thank you for your support.

Non-Uniform Days/Free Dress Days: Non-Uniform Days are also referred to as Free Dress Days. On these occasions, students are permitted to wear something other than school uniform. For

example, on days when your child has skating, he/she may dress in something other than school uniform that is conducive to skating. Your child's teacher will communicate these dates to you directly.

<u>Pizza Ordering Information:</u> To raise money for their Sunnybrae trip in June our grade 7's are responsible for the pizza lunch program here at St Ann's. All pizza orders for the first pizza day of the year need to be in by Monday, September 18th. Attached to this email are the order forms. You have the option of ordering monthly or for the year.

Supervision will be provided by other elementary staff members and the vice principal during this time.
