Feeding our Futures Grant

"As busy parents deal with global inflation, school food programs can help reduce the pressure on their wallets while tackling student hunger," said Rachna Singh, Minister of Education and Child Care. The Province's new *Feeding Futures* funding grant invests in building and expanding local school food programs. St. Ann's Academy has received a grant from the Ministry of Education with the intention of assisting low income families who need help to reduce the challenges of rising food costs. Bussing Services

If your child needs to ride the bus occasionally, they <u>MUST</u> have a bus pass from the school office. Bus passes are \$7.50 and must be shown to the driver. Unfortunately, the student will not be permitted to ride the bus that day unless they have a ticket. **Please note the South Shore bus run is at capacity, and no bus passes will be issued.**

If you pay monthly please note that your January payment is now due.
