Uniform and Dress Code

This is a friendly reminder that St. Ann's Academy is a uniformed school. There are currently three (3) mandatory daily uniforms: elementary, new high school (Mandatory for all Grade 8 students and optional for grades 9-12) and old high school uniforms. In high school, students cannot mix and match items between the new and old uniform pieces. The full uniform requirements can be found online in the <u>handbook</u>.

Notes for all uniforms: Pants and shorts must be straight-legged, loosely hemmed (no elastic cuffs, yoga pants, or sweatpants material) and have no exterior pockets (cargo/utility style).

Morning Drop-off

To ensure proper flow of traffic in the mornings, please only drop your children off in front of the chain link fence on the upper field. **Please do not pull into parking stalls** as it creates safety issues when backing out of the stall.
