#### **New:** Feeding our Futures

"As busy parents deal with global inflation, school food programs can help reduce the pressure on their wallets while tackling student hunger," said Rachna Singh, Minister of Education and Child Care. "Working with local schools to make sure our kids are fed and ready to learn will make a real difference for families and communities."

The Province is continuing the Feeding Futures funding grant. This grant invests in building and expanding local school food programs. St. Ann's Academy has received a grant from the Ministry of Education with the intention of assisting families in need with food security to reduce the challenges of rising food costs. # New: Deciding When Your Child Is Too Sick for School

Deciding if your child is too sick to attend school is not always easy. As a general guideline, children should remain at home if they are unwell and unable to participate fully in routine school activities.

Please keep your child at home if they have:

- <u>Fever</u> keep them home until they are fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of medication.
- Vomiting or diarrhea keep them home for 48 hours after the last episode.
- Severe sore throat.
- Rash with no known cause.
- Severe cough, especially if accompanied by other symptoms such as a runny nose or headache.
- Redness, swelling, or discharge from the eyes, ears, or skin (unless under treatment).
- General unwellness if your child is unusually tired, irritable, or lacking energy to join in school
  activities

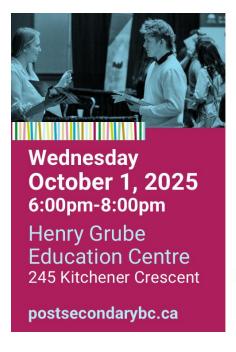
